### LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Last week, I wrote a reflection on the Preparation of the Gifts, the first part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This week I would like to share some reflections on the second part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Eucharistic Prayer. The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal calls it "the center and summit of the entire celebration." This is a fitting title, since it is through this great prayer of thanksgiving that the gifts of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. (Remember that the word **Eucharist** itself means thanksgiving.) The priest prays the prayer in the name of the community. He invites the people to lift up their hearts to the Lord in prayer and thanksgiving. He unites the congregation with himself in the prayer that he addresses in the name of the entire community to God the Father through Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. The Eucharistic Prayer demands that all listen to it with reverence and in silence.

The elements making up the Prayer are the following:

- **Thanksgiving:** The prayer begins by glorifying God the Father and giving thanks for the whole work of salvation or for some special aspect of it that corresponds to the day, feast, or season. This happens in the Preface, the first part of the Eucharistic Prayer. "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks."
- **Acclamation:** The whole congregation, joining with the heavenly powers, sings the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy). This acclamation is sung by all the people with the priest.
- **Epiclisis:** This is the part of the prayer in which the Church calls down the power of the Holy Spirit so that the gifts offered by human hands may be consecrated into the Body and Blood of Christ. "Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts..."
- **Institution Narrative and Consecration:** These are the words and actions of Jesus himself, "This is my Body. This is my Blood." Through them the Sacrifice is carried out which Christ himself instituted at the Last Supper, when he offered his Body and Blood under the elements of bread and wine, gave them to his Apostles to eat and drink, and left them the command to perpetuate this same mystery.
- **Anamnesis:** This is a word which means memorial. The Church keeps the memorial of Christ, recalls the blessed Passion, glorious Resurrection, and Ascension of Christ into heaven. "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven."
- **Offering:** As mentioned last week, this is the real Offertory of the Mass. Here the Church offers in the Holy Spirit the spotless Victim to the Father. The Church also intends that the faithful learn to offer themselves, and so fully enter, through Christ, into unity with God and with each other, so that at last God may be all in all. "We offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice."
- **Intercessions:** As is the case with all intercessions, these, too, are prayers in which we petition God for our needs. The prayer expresses the fact that the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the entire Church, of heaven as well as of earth, and that the offering is made for her and for all her members, living and dead, who have been called to participate in the redemption and salvation purchased by Christ's Body and Blood. "Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church." "May he make of us an eternal offering to you." "May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world."
- **Final Doxology:** Doxology is praise and glory given to the Trinity. "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." This glorification of God is confirmed and concluded by the people's "Amen." This proclamation is often called the Great Doxology. The prayer "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit" is called the Minor Doxology.

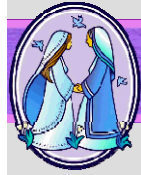

## Would you like to reach out to other moms? Then why not get involved in the re-start of our Elizabeth Ministry here at St. Gabriel Parish?



### What is Elizabeth Ministry?

Elizabeth Ministry is an international movement designed to support women and families during the joys, challenges and sorrows of childbearing years and beyond.

### How Does it Work?

Ministers are women sharing their presence, stories, and experience in the hope that these will encourage another woman and her family. Volunteers become ministers in the areas they have experienced. For example, a woman who has twins would visit and mentor a woman expecting twins.

### Opportunities for Involvement

**Pregnancy:** Ministers bring a Gift and Resource Kit to a pregnant woman.

**Celebration of Birth:** Ministers bring a Celebration of Birth Gift and Resource Kit to a family of a newborn.

**Crisis or Special Needs:** The joy and celebration of birth can be unrealized when a child is born premature, is in an intensive care nursery, or has special needs such as surgical intervention or a chronic illness. Ministers bring a Gift and Resource Kit.

**Family Support:** At times a Minister needs to provide help in family living, which may include:

- **Direct Service** – babysitting, running errands or making meals.
- **Special Friend** – Children of our church without extended families in the area benefit from a special “church friend” who acts as grandparent or aunt/uncle. Visits take place in the presence of the parents.

### Behind the Scenes

Preparations that take place behind the scenes are precisely those that enhance a particular ministry. People are needed to make items for the Gift and Resource Kits, such as baby afghans.
